Session 5 Leveraging PH WINS to Strengthen the Public Health Nursing Workforce

PH WINS Overview

- **PH WINS (Public Health Workforce Interests and Needs Survey)** is a national survey of the governmental public health workforce.
- **Primary goal:** inform workforce **recruitment and retention** efforts.
- **Survey instrument:** includes multiple topic areas; the **Workplace Infrastructure** section rotates each cycle to reflect current workforce priorities.
- **2024 PH WINS scale:**
 - 56,595 employees completed the survey
 - 37% response rate
 - Largest PH WINS survey to date

PH WINS Recruitment Approach

- Recruitment supported through national and field-based partnerships:
 - Partner organizations assist with **state-level recruitment**
 - **Public Health Training Centers (PHTCs)** support recruitment of local health departments
 - **Big Cities Health Coalition** supports participation from large city health departments

Public Health Nurses (PHN) Snapshot

- PHN workforce trends older:
 - Ages 36–54 represent ~51% of PHNs
- Pipeline considerations:
 - Majority of younger nurses enter public health from **outside the field**
 - 84% report coming from “different jobs,” rather than public health–specific roles

Workforce Attrition: Who Is Leaving and Why

- Primary reasons for leaving:
 - Pay
 - Work overload and burnout
 - Job satisfaction
 - Organizational climate and culture
 - Stress
- Approximately **34%** leave **governmental public health**
- Retirement accounts for approximately **5%** of departures

Get Access to Data

- **PH WINS Dashboard**
 - Live data exploration and filtering
 - Methodology (“Behind the Numbers”) available
 - User guide includes data request process
- **Data access**
 - Custom data requests supported
 - Research use permitted via formal request
- **State and local comparisons**
 - State and local health department dashboards available
 - Password-protected; access provided through request

- **Do you have data on how many hold a BSN degree?**
 - Yes, but it is not currently displayed on the dashboard
 - Over 50% based on current data
 - Can be pulled and added to the PHN Learning Lab library
- **How did you determine who is included in the “nurses” category—by degree or job classification?**
 - Both job type and degree are used
- **Is there information on retiring as a reason for leaving?**
 - Approximately 5%

- **Is there a way to compare within a state across all local health departments?**
 - Yes, via the state and local health department dashboard
 - Dashboard is password-protected but can be shared widely
 - Requests submitted through the user guide page
- **Do you include school nurses as public health nurses?**
 - No, school nurses are not specifically captured in PH WINS job classifications
- **Is there data on PHNs being replaced by Community Health Workers or other public health specialists?**
 - Not well disaggregated in the dashboard
 - May be possible through a custom data request
 - Current indication suggests this trend is relatively low
- **Can we access the data for research purposes?**
 - Yes, submit a data and support request through the PH WINS dashboard support page
- **Is it possible to compare responses across tiers (frontline, supervisors, executives)?**
 - Yes, filters are available in the dashboard
- **Are there plans to bring back 2021 items on health equity and racism?**
 - These topics rotate by survey cycle
 - 2024 included related items under “community engagement”

- Language adjustments were required due to federal funding
